

Guitar Plugins Set

Please find full instructions for installing this plug-in set in the Of Note blog post [Working sets, My Plugins, and curated plug-ins in Sibelius](#). More compact installation instructions can be found here.

This set consists of the plug-in files folder **Guitar Plugins** and the text file of plug-in names **Guitar Plugins.txt**.

To install these files you must have previously installed the downloadable plug-in *Install New Plugin* (category *Other*), which will copy the plug-in files to an appropriate location.

The Plug-in Files Folder

The plug-in files folder **Guitar Plugins** contains Sibelius plug-in files that were downloaded from the Sibelius download page on the date of the zip file that contains this document.

They might not be the most recent versions of these plug-ins when you install them, but plug-ins are rarely updated, so there is a good chance they will be the most recent versions.

Run the plug-in *Install New Plugin*. You will want to create a new plug-in folder to hold the files you will import, so choose the button *Create a new plug-in folder or choose an empty folder...*, which will bring up another dialog. In its *Subfolder name* edit box type in **Guitar Plugins Set**, then click OK.

Choose *Get Folder of Plug-in Files*, navigate to the location of the plug-in files folder, and the plug-ins in the folder will be installed. *My Plugins*, which will be needed later, is included in the folder of plug-ins and so will be installed as well.

You will need to close and restart Sibelius before you can run any plug-ins you have just installed. If you look in the *Plug-ins* menu (*Home > Plug-ins* for Sibelius 7+) you should find the entry **Guitar Plugins Set**, which will contain the plug-ins you just installed, including *My Plugins*, which you will be able to run from this menu.

The Text File of Plug-in Names

Guitar Plugins.txt is a list of the names of shipping and downloadable plug-ins, which should all be installed at this time.

Run *My Plugins*. Choose the *Customize* button, then the button *From file of plugin names*, and navigate to the text file of plug-in names and click on *Open*.

Choose OK and you should see the plugin names in the *My Plugins* List, and you can run any of these plug-in by typing the 1-character shortcut or selecting a list entry and clicking on *Run Plugin*.

Once *My Plugins* is installed, you should keep track of where it was installed or create a keyboard shortcut for it in *File > Preferences*.
